The purpose of Plagiarism School is to take advantage of the opportunity to reeducate and reform students who are caught plagiarizing. It is appropriate for first-time offenders and should be used as a way to mitigate a sanction applied by the instructor. For example, if the student was given a failing grade for the assignment or course as a result of plagiarizing, the student could be offered the chance to do the assignment again for a grade after completing plagiarism school. Participating in Plagiarism School does not eliminate the need to report incidents of plagiarism in accordance with university policy.
