

Uploading files to the Kent Personal Server using FUGU on a MAC

Download and install **Fugu**. It's free. Here's a link to the CNET Download site:

Run **Fugu**

In the type-in boxes type the following information as shown below:

Connect to:

User Name:

Port: **Leave this box empty**

Directory:

Click on the **Connect** button

Click **Continue** when/if prompted

Enter your Kent State Flashline **password** when prompted.

You will be connected to the server.

On the left is a window with your "local" computer's files/folders/drives

On the right is a window with the server folders and files.

You should be INSIDE the public_html folder because you entered that as the "directory" when you logged in.

Now, just in the left window, **browse to the location where you saved your website files or folder** and either:

OPTION 1

Drag and drop BOTH the **index.html** file and the folder named, **Site**, from the window on the left into the window on the right.

*(Be careful not to drop the **index.html** file or **Site** folder into another folder! Also, make sure you don't drop the **index.html** file into the **Site** folder!!!)*

If you do it this way the URL to your website will be

<http://www.personal.kent.edu/~yourusername/>

The above address will automatically “look” inside the public_html folder on the server and open the webpage named index.html

OPTION 2

The second option would be to create a folder for your website (see below) then Drag and Drop the folder you created to hold your site onto the server.

For example, if you created a folder and named it, **website**, and saved your i-Web website into that folder, then by putting the folder, **website**, on the server your URL to the website would become: <http://www.personal.kent.edu/~yourusername/website>

*Inside the “**website**” folder is the **index.html** file and a folder called **Site***

The advantage of doing it this way is so that you can have multiple websites on your server by just putting each different website into a differently named folder then adding the folder name to the end of the URL as shown above.

Saving the i-Web website. Where the heck is it?

There isn’t any “Save as” in i-Web. When you save an **i-Web website**, it just automatically names the “home page”, **index.html**. In addition, a folder called, **Site**, is created. The **Site** folder holds all the different pages, all the pictures, etc. So when you use **Option 1** above for uploading, that’s why **you need to upload BOTH the “index.html” file AND the “Site” folder to the server.**

If you want to use **option 2** above, upload a folder that holds your i-Web website to the server. When you upload the folder to the server the index.html and Site folder that was created will be inside the uploaded folder as described in option 2.
