Searches the Internet for signs of plagiarism in papers. There's a free trial copy of EVE that can be downloaded and used for 15 days. Search engine for the web.

Glatt Plagiarism Services

Offers different services, including a tutorial program to teach students about plagiarism, a screening program to detect plagiarism, and a self-detection program to catch unintentional occurrences of plagiarism (free). The screening program works by eliminating every fifth word of the suspected student's paper. The student is then asked to supply the missing words.

Turn It In

Online system. Searches "gated web" as well as free web content. Also checks against papers already "turned in" through TurnItIn. Both students and faculty must learn software. Draft mode for teaching plagiarism. Student work stored in proprietary database. Works with Blackboard and WebCT for additional fee, for grading and roster import.
