My husband, working in Akron, was stopped at the City line from coming home because the city was closed down! When he finally did get home...I went for a run to calm the anxiety down and I was stopped by the Police with a Curfew in the City!

William was a sweet young man who created a large lawn decoration in a class. I loved it so much...he gave it to me. We had it in our yard as a monument to William, who should have had a full and wonderful life!
